Q1: What is the BOLI website?

**A1**: The BOLI website is: <a href="https://www.oregon.gov/boli/apprenticeship">https://oregonapprenticeship.org/</a> - currently maintained monthly. Some information might not be current. You can contact atdemail@boli.oregon.gov if you have a particular question.

**Q2**: Is the contact information accurate and current for each apprenticeship on the BOLI website?

**A2:** Yes, this information is updated frequently.

**Q3:** As a career counselor, I don't necessarily know how to best support and guide my students through trade careers and apprenticeship opportunities.

**A3:** Look at it through the same lens as college counseling: researching different trade careers, researching schools/sites that offer training, and reaching out to contacts for specific information. Reaching out to BOLI is a great option as well as <a href="https://www.apprenticeship.gov">www.apprenticeship.gov</a> and Builder Associations.

Q4: Do all community colleges have an apprenticeship contact?

A4: No. You can contact BOLI for specific contact information or contact specific community college.

**Q5:** I would like to get tradespeople or trades-related organizations to host a table at our college/career events.

**A5:** BOLI has limited staffing, but you can always contact BOLI for a database for county based programs to contact for outreach for presentations/tabling events.
