

The Oregon Student Access Commission (OSAC) is a state agency whose mission is to create a college-going culture for all Oregonians by providing access through information, mentoring, and financial support. OSAC administers more than 400 privately funded scholarship programs, the state's largest need-based grant - the Oregon Opportunity Grant, other public grants, and manages more than 145 ASPIRE mentoring sites to help students plan for postsecondary education and training after high school.

Timeline & Deadlines for Academic Year 2013-14

Chafee Education & Training Grant (for former foster youth)

- Deadlines: Fall Term - August 1; Winter term - November 1; Spring Term - February 1; Summer Term - May 1

November 2012

- Begin your OSAC Scholarship Application (OSAC Application) at www.OregonStudentAid.gov. Search for, select, and add scholarships directly to your application. Stay informed and receive important updates by joining OSAC at [Facebook.com/OSAC scholarships](https://www.facebook.com/OSACscholarships), and [Twitter.com/OSAC](https://twitter.com/OSAC).
 - **First-time applicants:** Set up your Student Profile at www.OregonStudentAid.gov to begin the OSAC Application.
 - **Returning applicants:** Update your OSAC Application from the previous year.
 - **High school Juniors:** Select your graduation year in the application, and update/submit during your senior year.
- Mentors and students can create a test application for teaching and practice.

January 2013

- File your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.gov; required for all scholarships that consider financial need. Correct FAFSA errors by March 15.
- Obtain your most recent transcripts (unofficial is accepted). Transmit directly to OSAC or scan a copy and upload to your application.
- Finalize your application, including any scholarship-specific documentation, if required.

February 2013

- February 1: Priority deadline for Oregon Opportunity Grant. Submit your FAFSA to determine eligibility.
- If you received an automatically renewable scholarship for 2012-13, log in to your Student Profile and renew for 2013-14.

February 15, 2013 (5:00 pm PST) Early Bird Deadline

- Receive an early application review and a chance to win a \$500 OSAC scholarship if you submit your completed and error-free OSAC Application by this date. If certain errors are found, you will receive an opportunity to make corrections.

March 1, 2013 (5:00 pm PST) Final Deadline to submit your OSAC Application

May 31, 2013 (5:00 pm PST) Student Child Care Grant Deadline for 2013-14

Apply Online

OSAC saves application data each time it's entered, so you can add to or update as often as needed before submitting.

Unless otherwise stated in the scholarship catalog you must:

- a. Be an Oregon resident. Residency requirements, including tribal residency, are available on the OSAC website.
- b. Be any of the following:
 - an Oregon graduating high school student, GED recipient, or home-schooled graduate for the 2012-13 academic year, or
 - a first-time college freshman, adult learner, or
 - an undergraduate or graduate student, or
 - a current high school junior who may start/update the application and submit it during his/her senior year.

Can scholarships be used out-of-state?

Most awards can be used at U.S. postsecondary institutions (public, private, nonprofit, and for-profit schools) that are eligible to participate in Title IV federal student aid programs. United States military academies are not eligible. Check individual scholarships for specific requirements.

What do I need before I begin my application?

You will need the following information before you apply online:

- Your social security number (required for need-based scholarships)
- Names of the colleges you are considering
- Your personal contact information (address, phone, cell phone, e-mail address, and parents/guardian contact information).

Required Documents

Personal Statements

(Available to download/print for practice only)

The four OSAC Personal Statements help selection committees better assess applicants. Each statement is limited to 1,000 characters (approx. 150 words).

1. Explain your career aspirations and your educational plan to meet these goals.
2. Explain how you have helped your family or made your community a better place to live. Please provide specific examples.
3. Describe a personal accomplishment and the strengths and skills you used to achieve it.
4. Describe a significant change or experience that has occurred in your life. How did you respond and what did you learn about yourself?

Activities Chart

(Available to download/print for practice only)

The Activities Chart is important to selection committees who want to see leadership, decision-making, organizational skills, special recognition, volunteer service, and work history.

Transcripts (Specific requirements are online)

The #1 reason for rejection is missing/incomplete transcripts. OSAC requires your most recent transcript(s), or equivalent as of the March 1 deadline (unofficial or web transcripts are fine).

Required transcripts are based on the student definitions below:

- **Graduating High School, GED, or Home-Schooled Students.**
Submit your transcript showing coursework/grades through senior year fall semester, second quarter, or first trimester; GED scores, or all required home school documents listed online.
- **College Freshmen, Continuing or Returning College Students, or College Graduate Students.**
Submit your most recent transcripts of all college coursework completed in the last 10 years. If college coursework is older than 10 years, provide either a complete high school transcript with graduation date, or a complete college transcript.
- **Adult Students with no college coursework or never graduated from high school, no GED, not home-schooled.**
Submit your high school transcript showing coursework and grades. If you're in the process of taking your GED tests, submit your most recent score report and a letter explaining when you will complete your requirements.

Additional Information May be Required

You may be asked to provide additional essays, information or documents. Review scholarship descriptions for instructions.

Other OSAC Opportunities - College Access

Oregon Opportunity Grant (OOG)

Established in 1972, the Oregon Opportunity Grant (OOG) is Oregon's largest state-funded, need-based grant program to help Oregon students go to college. In addition to meeting financial need requirements, eligible applicants must:

- Be an undergraduate student (no prior bachelor's degree)
- Be a U.S. citizen or eligible noncitizen
- Be enrolled at last half time (6 credit-hours/term or more)
- Attend a participating Oregon postsecondary institution
- Be an Oregon resident for at least 12 months prior to the period of enrollment

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) determines eligibility for the OOG. Awards are made on a first-come, first-served basis until funds are exhausted. Priority deadline is February 1st. Visit www.fafsa.gov to apply.

ASPIRE

(Access to Student Assistance Programs In Reach of Everyone)

ASPIRE is a mentoring program that helps middle school and high school students access education and training beyond high school. ASPIRE students learn about postsecondary options, admission requirements, and financial aid from trained, supportive adult volunteer mentors. Beginning with four pilot schools in 1998, ASPIRE is now serving 145 middle schools, high schools, and community-based organizations across Oregon. ASPIRE serves students by helping sites to:

- Build sustainable communities of volunteer mentors
- Inform students and families about the scholarship application process and other options for managing costs of postsecondary education
- Provide resources, encouragement, and the guidance of mentors

PUBLIC GRANTS

Federal Chafee Education and Training Grant (ETG)

The Chafee ETG assists foster youth by providing funding for education, training, and services necessary to obtain employment. Apply throughout the year by the deadlines on page 2.

Oregon Student Child Care Grant

This grant assists financially needy student-parents enrolled in postsecondary education to obtain safe, dependable care, while allowing completion of the parent's academic programs. The application, deadlines, and requirements are available online. Limited funding available.

Deceased and Disabled Public Safety Officer Grant

Available to the biological, adopted, or stepchildren of any Oregon public safety officer killed or disabled in the line of duty. Applicants must be Oregon residents planning to attend an Oregon public or nonprofit college. Apply any time.

Barber and Hairdresser Grant

Applicants must file the FAFSA and attend a licensed school of barbering, hair design, cosmetology, or manicure in Oregon.

Jobs Plus — Individual Education Accounts

Qualify through the JOBS Plus Program. This program is open to clients of the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Program through the Department of Human Services.

Oregon Youth Conservation Corps

Recipients must participate in the OYCC Community Corps program, which provides education, training, and employment opportunities to disadvantaged and at-risk youth ages 16 to 25.

Ford Scholars Program – for graduating high school seniors or transferring community college students.

Ford ReStart Program – for students, age 25 years of age or older, with limited or no recent college experience.

Ford Opportunity Program – for single parents who are heads of household with custody of dependents and who are without the support of a domestic partner.

Ford Sons and Daughters Program – for dependents of employees of Roseburg Forest Products who are 21 years of age or younger.

- Offering several unique, renewable scholarships, the Foundation will select up to 260 new recipients and award more than \$10 million this year to college students.
- Successful applications demonstrate an understanding of the values of work, taking responsibility, and helping others.
- Applicants must file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and meet Expected Family Contribution (EFC) requirements (*except for the Ford Sons & Daughters Program*). Selected recipients must enroll in a full-time, on-campus program in the fall at an eligible institution. Additional requirements apply to each program.
