



## DATA KEY

FAFSA Plus+ is aimed at increasing the number of Oregon students who complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). FAFSA Plus+ sites are provided access to FAFSA data for their senior class. This data allows sites to perform targeted assistance to students.

**FafsaSubmitted Date:** The date that the student submitted the FAFSA.

**FafsaProcessed Date:** The date the FAFSA was processed.

### **Verified:**

- **True** = Some information needs to be verified; the student must submit additional documentation. Verification may involve submitting financial documentation, documentation needed for independent student status, etc. The Financial Aid Office at the college will contact the student about what needs to be verified.
- **False** = No verification is needed at this time. However, the Financial Aid Office at the college may later select a FAFSA for verification and that will may or may not be updated in the portal, since FAFSA Plus+ only shows verifications selected by Federal Student Aid (FSA).

### **Rejected:**

- **True** = The application has been rejected. FSA will email the student about their rejection status. The student must correct one or more items in the FAFSA. Students should contact FSA directly for assistance (see below).  
*Common reasons for rejection include:*
  - Using an incorrect social security number
  - Not using the student name as it appears on their Social Security Card
  - Failure to sign the FAFSA (student and/or parent/guardian)
- **False** = The FAFSA is complete.

**A fully processed FAFSA will have a submission date, processed date, TRUE OR FALSE in the Verified column, and FALSE in the Rejected column.**
